Health Office Reminder:

Is My Child Well Enough To Go To School?

Please keep your child home if:

- They have a FEVER (≥ 100°). Students must stay home until they have been fever free for 24 hours without the aid of fever reducing medication. Measure your child's temperature before giving medications to reduce fever.
- They are VOMITING(two or more episodes). Students must stay home for 24 hours after last episode.
- They have ANY RASH that may be disease related, or the cause is unknown. Check with your child's physician before returning to school.

If your child has DIARRHEA, please abide by the following:


• School Aged:Your child can attend school unless they are not feeling well and/or have diarrhea and need to use the bathroom frequently. (Schools may require exclusion during outbreaks.)

Hugo dismissal time is 3:35. In the event that you need to pick up your child early from school, please email your child's teacher and hugodismissalrequest@isd624.org. If you have a late day change (after 2:30), please call the office to insure the message gets to the teacher.

For safety reasons, we cannot allow early pick-up (without prior notice) once students are in transition at the end of the day. This would be anytime between 3:20 and 3:35. Once students are transitioning in the hallways, we ask that you wait until all students are where they need to be.
