- Voiding and replacing one check, waiting to hear back from payee on 2nd, contacted Red Balloon Bookstore for status of 3rd
- All have been reconciled
- Budget-at-a-glance
 - FYTD Income \$42,749.04
 - FYTD Expenses \$38,597.89
 - Funds needed to cover budget: \$12,550.96 (if we spend every dollar)
 - Projected Income: ~\$15,000 (Color Run income estimated)
 - Known expenses expected:
 - \$2687.93 Oneka Media Center reading nook
 - \$1400.00 Staff Appreciation Week
 - \$1664.05 Technology Support for Hugo
 - \$5758.98 TOTAL ESTIMATED EXPECTED EXPENSES (round to \$6000 for easy calculations)
 - Total expenses (FYTD + Estimated Expected) \$44597.89
 - Funds needed to cover expected total expenses: \$1848.85
 - What does this mean?
 - We are likely to have a budget overage for 2018-19 school year!

 - Removed obsolete line items (Ashland Productions, Media Center Updates, Yearbook)
 - PTA Social Events umbrella over Bingo Night & Roller Skating Night
 - Staff Appreciation umbrella over Conference Dinner & Staff Appreciation Week
 - New line item All School Book Clubs umbrella over Hugo Book Series
 & One Book, One School gives more permanence to programs
 - Book fairs fundraiser is paid out as Scholastic dollars no cash income
- Janet Dickinson 4th Grade Teacher Funding Change Request
 - Came to the meeting to see if the 4th grade magazine subscription funds could shift to be used for additional technology funding on an IXL math technology program instead.
 - great feedback from a few teachers who currently use

- kids can use in classroom and at home
- appreciate magazine subscriptions, but don't always have time to use
- Discussion of how the proposed budget should reflect this change
 - Moving \$333.33 (%) of the magazine subscriptions to technology subscriptions for the express use by 4th grade teachers.
 - Change magazine subscriptions budget to \$4333.33
 - change made for the '19-'20 school year; then reassess

 - Terry shared that she has served as Hugo/Oneka principal for 15 years and that it had been fun to see the growth. The one thing that she felt that remained consistent over her time of service was the commitment from parents. She reminded us that this was our time of service and that plenty before us had served their time. She ended by stating that she has truly enjoyed her job and coming to work every day.

 - not present
- Color Run (May 4th) Jennifer Larson
 - 632 estimated runners
 - 680 supporters anyone who donated online or with cash/check
 - online portion was very hard to use
 - hard for donors and Jennifer had to hand enter all sales info into a spreadsheet that she created
 - hoping to earn \sim \$25,000
 - "contract" (never signed) currently states that we will earn 70% profit
 - due to all of the issues, trying to get all of the profit money (minus the online credit card processing fees)
 - Jennifer documented all of her work so can be passed along to the next committee chair
 - Suggestions of needed roles
 - committee chair
 - volunteer coordinator
 - sponsorship
 - school liaison

- Heather Comstock was going to shadow and willing to help, but wants to run the race; looking for someone to co-chair
- Rick spoke to the amazing job that Jennifer did bad platform
 - Rick is going to try to help us get as much of our profit as possible, but challenging because of Cherrydale bankruptcy
- Our event costs \$4752.59
 - down from last year
 - Jennifer did a great job negotiating
- Staff Appreciation (May 6th-10th) Michelle Anderson
 - Amazing job, Michelle!
 - Teachers and PTA very much appreciated all of the wonderful goodies!

8. Funding Requests

- Anthony Vomela, Boy Scout Little Free Library
 - Who?
 - former Hugo and Oneka student
 - boy scout with Hugo Troop 151
 - What?
 - met with Hugo staff to discuss and brainstorm ideas
 - Build Three Little Free Libraries mutually decided upon
 - When?
 - build and install this summer
 - Where?
 - one at Hugo Elementary; one at Oneka Elementary; one TBD
 - plus a box to drop off books
 - Why?
 - working to earn his Eagle Scout status
 - bring books to Hugo/Oneka students and families
 - Cost?
 - anticipating ~\$600 cost
 - charter sign
 - costs \$40 to register
 - get an engraved charter sign with unique number
 - puts libraries on the map
 - Request
 - asking ~\$650-\$700 from the PTA
 - fall under special funding request
 - Lauren Schleicher made a motion to spend up to \$700
 - Jason Healy seconded the request
 - Request approved!
 - work with the Vomela family
 - ideally save receipts to turn in for reimbursement

- Thanked Terry for all of her hard work and explained that she had been a great advocate for the school and parent work.
- Rick formerly represented Chip Shoppe bought by Cherrydale Farms
 - mistake; many things not up to his standards
 - Rick knew things were troubled; unfortunately, too late for our run
 - Hugo/Oneka is his biggest account
- New Partnership with Believe Kids
 - to be signed on Wednesday (5/15/19)
 - innovative
 - great systems
 - text to pay
 - started about same time as Chip Shoppe
 - no debt
 - operate out of Colorado
 - maintain a distribution center here
 - Fall fundraiser
 - similar products (still have wrapping paper)
 - good value
 - Rick/Renee have a long history working with us
 - take good care of us; very helpful
 - same profit percentages
 - will work with us and do what he can to represent us
- Rick said he will take back his ownership shares with School-Athon (Color Run).
- Angela Thompson thanked Rick for coming, especially on short notice, and told him that we would need to take some time to make some decisions about our future fundraising events and that we would get back to him.
